We are now accepting Teaching Support Grant proposals

These grants provide funding to Penn State faculty who are working on projects to improve student learning. In line with the Institute's strategic aims for the year, we encourage proposals in three areas:

- 1) Interdisciplinary projects involving multiple fields of study and multiple faculty members, as well as the students they teach;
- 2) Disciplinary Communities projects involving multiple Penn State campuses and multiple faculty members who share a single discipline;
- 3) Individual projects involving one faculty member and his/her students.

Application procedure

Proposals must be submitted using our online form. Note: The online form is not designed for you to save your work. If you wish to save the document as you go, we recommend that you compose in your preferred software and cut and paste into our online form.

Deadline

October 2, 2009, for 2009/2010 projects, funding distributed in December 2009.

Review Process

This is a competitive process. In recent cycles, only one-third to one-half of submitted proposals have been funded, some only partially. Proposers are therefore encouraged to make sure their projects are clearly linked to our strategic goals. All proposals are reviewed by teams of Institute instructional consultants using our Teaching Support Grant review rubric.
